#### Dear Fellow Mystics,

Greetings from my hermitage, now day 217. Thanks to the clear sight that flows from Centering Prayer, we find wisdom and strength in this current chaos. "We shall no longer be children, or tossed one way and another, and carried hither and thither by every new gust of teaching, at their unscrupulousness in deliberate deception. If we live by the truth and love, we shall grow completely into Christ, who is the head by whom the whole Body is fitted and joined together." Ephesians 4:14-16

Mirabai Starr challenges us to "leap from the lip of the vessel and dive into the unknown... sacred scriptures of all faiths call us to love as we have never loved before. This requires effort, vigilance, and radical humility. Violence is easier than nonviolence, yet hate only perpetuates hate. The wisdom teachings remind us that love—active, engaged, fearless love—is the only way to save ourselves and each other from the firestorm of war that rages around us. There is a renewed urgency to this task now. We are asked not only to tolerate the other, but also to actively engage the love that transmutes the lead of ignorance and hatred into the gold of authentic connection. This is the "narrow gate" Christ speaks of in the Gospels [Matthew 7:13]. Don't come this way unless you're willing to stretch, bend, and transform for the sake of love." Desmond Tutu advises "Soon after church and business leaders helped to broker a National Peace Accord in South Africa in 1991, I talked to my fellow bishops about the need for contemplation as well as activism during the transition to democracy. I talked about the importance of the hidden, the inner life, of pouring oil and balm on wounds, of nurturing our people for the tasks of transformation. This was not being pietistic. I knew that it was important to cultivate an authentic spirituality of transformation in that transition period of much flux, bewilderment, violence, and turbulence. This authentic spirituality of transformation is the basis for any true and lasting transfiguration in our world. Discovering stillness, hearing God's voice, is not . . . a luxury of a few contemplatives. It is the basis for real peace and real justice." God Has a Dream: A Vision of Hope for Our Time (Image Books: 2004), 108-109.

This 8-session program includes four weekly follow-up sessions that begin in January 2021. (Approximately 1½ hours each)

"Centering Prayer is a method designed to facilitate the development of contemplative prayer by preparing our faculties to cooperate with this gift. It is an attempt to present the teaching of earlier times (e.g. the 14<sup>th</sup> century book <u>The Cloud of Unknowing</u>) in an updated form and to put a certain order and regularity into it. It is not meant to replace other kinds of prayer; it simply puts other kinds of prayer into a new and fuller perspective. During the time of prayer we consent to God's presence and action within. At other times, our attention moves outward to discover God's presence everywhere."
